2.) If there is a limit, where is it stated in the Rules and what criteria determines the limit?

"Do the players in general know one another?"

I do not know, some do and some don't.

- 1.) What percentage of players must know each other?
- 2.) Is there somewhere in the rules that gives us a quideline to follow in that regard?

"Are there prizes other than money?"

No.

"Is the event conducted for profit?"

So far as I know the Pro will make a profit each time an event is conducted at their golf course. The people who make and sell golf equipment stand to make a profit. The food and beverage people made a profit. I am sure there are others who provide services that make a profit.

- 1.) If you are asking if some one else makes a profit besides the Pro or owner of the course, how does that concern what I am asking?
- 2.) Is that somehow against the rules of Amateur status?
- 3.) If your question is in reference to paragraph four of USGA POLICY ON GAMBLING "Organized amateur events open to the general golfing public and designed and promoted to create <u>cash prizes</u>...", the key words being <u>cash prizes</u>, since paragraph three determined that the players are "golf wagering" this paragraph appears not to apply to the event I described in my letter, dated Nov. 5, 1990.

"Is the fact that money prizes are to be awarded advertised in a club publication or flyer?"

Yes, it advertised all money in the purse would be paid out.

As you can tell, I have tried to explain my answers, and where I do not understand the reason for your question, have asked you to clarify further. I hope you will not take offense at my retorts, rather, please attempt to understand my confusion.
